The best way to help your child learn to read is by example! Read to your child every chance you get! Read with excitement, funny voices, and enthusiasm. This will instill a love for reading as well as a motivation to read for your child. Here are some suggestions to make reading a wonderful time in your home.

- Choose books that interest your child.
- Let them hear the same book over and over
- Let your child tell the story in their own words
- Make reading nightly a warm, fun, time for all
- Visit the library and let your child choose books to check out
- Don't force your child to sound out the word, just read it!
- Encourage your child to make up their own stories
- Ask questions about the book. What's your favorite part? Why?
- Rhyme! Make up silly words that rhyme together

- Make sure to look carefully and discuss the illustrations- they can tell the story
