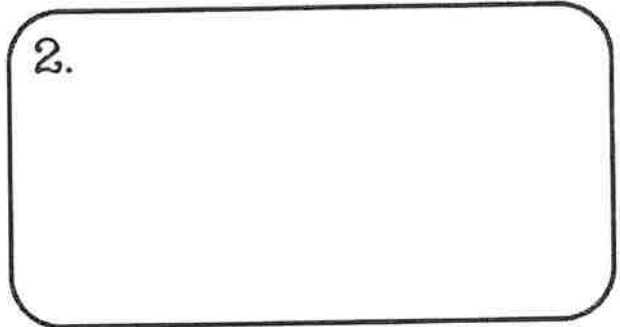
Lemonade Stand: *Selling Tips*

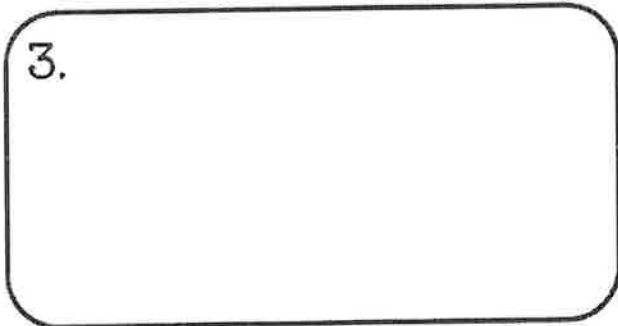
